In February, we travelled to Kathy's Home for our third trip to see the Hmong kids. We still cannot communicate very well, but we love visiting them. The highlight this time was teaching them some new games. We tried playing dodge-ball, but they didn't understand the concept of "getting out" once they're hit with the ball. So, we switched games to kickball. Mike thought they would understand the rules if they knew baseball. Only 1 boy out of 50 heard of baseball, but none knew how to play! We had to explain what bases were, why you had to run to each one, and why the team in the field tried to get the runner out. Though it took a while to try to explain from English to Thai, they finally got the hang of it. That's when the ball was punctured by a spiky plant and immediately deflated!

Trying to explain the basics of kickball is similar to our task ahead of us when



sharing who God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit is. We must start from the beginning. "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth," Genesis 1:1. Who is God? What kind of God is He? What is sin? How can God have a Son? The Hmong worship the unseen world of spirits. They have a religion of fear and constantly work for peace with the demons. We offer hope and peace through the grace Jesus gave us.

Wasting Time?

Learning Thai is essential. Some people don't think it's important to support missionaries while they learn a foreign language because they're not engaged in sharing the Gospel. On the contrary, the people we wish to reach want to hear the Good News in their own language. Our credibility and their attention goes out the window if we always have to use a translator. Some concepts are never grasped unless you know the culture of the people to whom you minister.

There are Thai words that have no English translation because it is part of their culture. Sonja is just starting to learn to read and write - a daunting task considering there are 44 consonants, 28 vowels, 5 tones, and over 20 different tone rules! Mike continues to practice listening and speaking. It is still difficult for both of us to understand native speakers! But we continue to learn more everyday.
