## **Project 316: The Excitement Continues!!!**

The closer we get to completing everything for the audio players the more excited we become! We are now close to 90% complete with all of the teaching material that is being produced. We are still waiting for a few key lessons to be recorded by our translator and friend, Ja (Hmong: Tsav). And we are aiming towards the end of November/early December to have all of the introductions to the New Testament books translated and recorded.

The believers who are part of our home church that meets at Berean Bible Church in Pottstown, PA have initiated a fund drive so that we can purchase additional players. We firmly believe that these players will make a huge impact in the lives of the Hmong here in South East Asia. So, if you wanted to give some funds to help, you still have time to get involved and be part of the initial distribution of the first batch of audio players (see the PDF for details). We hope that they will be complete and ready to go sometime during the Hmong New Year celebrations when

the rice harvest is finished. We are in contact with personnel who will call us as soon as the new audio players are available. Right now we haven't heard anything, so we pray that everything goes well, and that they will soon be made available to buy.
