We are very excited to be back in the US in order to raise more funds for the ever increasing demand for Project 316 audio players! Lives have been changed as a result of the Hmong listening to the teachings

For most Hmong,

even those that are believers, especially those living high up in the mountains in villages that have no electricity or the ability to get an education, the audio players have and will become extremely beneficial for believers to grow in their faith and to have a tool to share the Gospel with others. Many of the Hmong who live in these areas, particularly in northern Laos, northern Vietnam, and southern China are severely persecuted for their faith in

Christ. Most Westerners have found it very difficult and even impossible to gain access to these remote parts of the world. It is a dangerous place for believers to penetrate, let alone missionaries who are not native to the area. However, the body of Christ is growing rapidly. When asked what believers needed most they simply answer, "Teaching from God's Word." The audio players were designed for places like this and through the dedication of believers willing to sacrifice their lives in order to bring God's teachings to them, it will be well worth the effort. Therefore, the demand for the audio

players will increase.

Despite being persecuted, believers continue to share the Gospel with others,



often putting their own lives in danger as well as those of extended family members who are not believers. In many villages, the non-believing family members are forced to put pressure on



believers to deny their faith. If they don't, the police will often destroy the non-believers crops and take their land away from them. Because many of the Hmong are farmers, their land is the most valuable thing that they own. So, not only do believers face persecution from the police, but they face intense persecution from within their own extended family. Yet they realize that the truth is the Word of God and are willing to die for it if need be.
