Project 316: New Technology and a plethora of New Teachings

Distributing Project 316 audio players and hearing how they have made an impact in the lives of others is why we and you (who continue to support us financially and prayerfully) continue in serving our Hmong brothers and sisters in this way. Together, we are making an eternal impact in the lives of others.

In the last two weeks of February, we hope to distribute at least 300 audio players

throughout S.E. Asia. The combined total since we started this project will be 950 audio players! With the help of our project team we have increased the amount of teachings up to 315 hours! And this year we are able to do something else. Since we have continued demand for the audio players and not enough supply, many of the Hmong (mostly in Thailand) have asked if they could have the teachings to listen to on

their cell phones (almost everyone in Thailand has a cell phone). They saw that the former audio player units two years ago worked off of a micro-SD card and wondered why the teachings couldn't be placed onto a micro-SD card for cell phones. We attempted to try that, but up

until this past year we have not been able to make this available due to technological issues. But now we have been able to overcome this problem! So this is wonderful news! The only downside is that listening to the teachings on a cell phone drains the phones' batteries much faster, and since the phones are not solar powered, they need to have a constant energy source to recharge them. For some believers this is okay especially if their fields are

close to their villages, but this is not an option if you are out in the fields for several days at a time, which many of the Hmong are. We are not sure how beneficial the micro-SD cards will be in Laos and Vietnam since the majority of the Hmong villages are in much more remote areas high up in the mountains where there is no electricity.



Meet Long Moua (Npuag Looj Muas)

Long Moua came to the US in 1978 when he was about 7 years old after living in a refugee camp for two years in Nong Khai, Thailand. His family had to flee from their home in Laos to escape from the Vietcong Communist during the Vietnam and "secret" war in Laos. He, his family and many other Hmong arrived and settled in Philadelphia, PA. After 11 years they moved to Lancaster County, PA. He became a believer when he was a teenager and today has a desire to see the Hmong come to know Christ and grow in their faith. He's been a dedicated supporter of our ministry to the Hmong and he will be going to Thailand with me to help as a translator. Praise God! This is the first time since 1978 that he's had the opportunity to go back to Southeast Asia.
