has allowed a delay. Why, you might ask? Because there is "new" technology being developed that will allow for more efficiency and a greater capacity for the teachings from God's Word. The new audio players (which will be available to buy in the coming months) will now be using SD cards for storage, rather than downloading updated material into the audio players via a portable computer unit. At the moment, it takes about one hour for two gigabits of information to be uploaded for each player. So, if you have 30 players in one village it would take two days to upload. Now with SD card capability we can simply exchange the SD cards in a very short period of time. Eventually the players will be scattered throughout several different villages. (Many even in highly persecuted and very remote areas throughout SE Asia.) Uploading new content will no longer be contingent on having the portable computer unit. Anyone can replace the SD cards.

If you were thinking about financially supporting this project, now is the time to do it! We are planning on placing an order in a couple of months and we would love to purchase as many units as possible. (See the "Project 316" PDF for more info.)
